

#### **PORT FAIRY**

On the Australia Day weekend, the Southern Freedivers had our annual trip to Port Fairy. We had a great couple of days of diving, which is usual for this part of the world. Many different species including snapper, whiting, squid and crayfish are regular inhabitants of the coastline, as well as the possibility of a kingfish, as has been the experience of our club members in the last few years.

On the Saturday we dived out the front of Griffiths Island which is only a couple of minutes from the town centre. This area is partly protected from the swell by a reef which breaks the surface about 150 metres off shore. The terrain varies here from still shallow water over sand in the lagoon to rocky reef in over 10 metres of water in the surf zone. About twelve of us spread out to explore the area. Plenty of fish were speared including pinkie snapper, whiting, banded morwong and boarfish to name a few. A couple of the guys also spotted snapper up to 2kgs.

That night, we all went back to where Paul and Robs' families were staying for a BBQ dinner. It was a feast of fresh fish prepared in various ways (my favourite was the fish in green curry) along with all the side dishes. We all had a great night socialising over the beautifully layed out banquet. Thanks to the Dorfstatters and Milers and their helpers for all the food

preparation, and providing the ideal setting for a club function.

Our dive at Killarney was saved for the Sunday. As many would agree, this is arguably the best dive site in Victoria. Here, there is a huge lagoon area with varying terrain satisfying most species around, as well as the reef outside the lagoon where crayfish and big sweep are common. Matt and Ziya had their bag limit of two crays each out there within 15 minutes, and Louie landed a 1.1kg sweep. Inside the lagoon is the land of the giant whiting with many being caught over 500 grams and

others still out there over 1kg. Along with plenty of trumpeter, boarfish, pinkies, leatherjacket, this place has something for everyone. The size of fish, the range of species and the possibilities of kingfish and record size catches are what makes Killarney such a great destination. The added bonus of having a fish cleaning table with hose back on shore is just extra cream!
